#### **Emergency Operations**

NWTEMC assisted in the response to two disaster events this year: The December Snow (DR-1824 Oregon, DR-1825 Washington)/ January Flooding (DR-1817, WA) and the H1N1 Flu outbreak in May. During both times NWTEMC's EOC was activated and assisted in coordinating with State and Federal agencies with the Tribes.

For the Flood event, NWTEMC traveled to the flooded areas, gathered reports and disseminated daily situation reports to assist in response.

During the recovery phase, NWTEMC accompanied FEMA to our affected Tribes. NWTEMC worked closely with FEMA staff and Tribal Emergency managers with the on-going Disaster assistance process.

Following the floods, the NWTEMC helped prepare several Hazard Mitigation Grants and are currently assisting several Tribes with the drafting of these very important planning documents.

During the H1N1 Flu breakout, NWTEMC set up a webpage devoted to sharing information on the emerging threat. NWTEMC also distributed a great deal of educational materials, provided coordination amongst our Tribal partners during the activation of our EOCs, as well as prepared situation reports as events unfolded.

NWTEMC worked very closely with the Indian Health Service, the North Portland Area Indian Health Board, the American Indian Health Commission and the Department of Health to provide coordinated assistance and up to date information to all parties.

NWTEMC further worked toward acquiring equipment, materials and supplies to better prepare our Tribal communities. 2009 saw the placement of seven emergency management trailers granted by the Washington State Department of Health, completely outfitted with the materials and supplies needed to teach the Community Emergency Response Team Training.

The NWTEMC was very proud this year to have been asked to have their website linked to most of our emergency management partners. Many of our partners redirected their internet traffic to our site for the most current updates during our declared disasters this year.

### Medical Reserve Corps

2008-2009 was a very exciting year for Tribal MRC development in the Northwest. Three new units were established and registered: Shoalwater Bay, Yakama Tribes and Lower Elwha. Handbooks were developed and distributed for Shoalwater Bay and Yakama. Distribution within the Lower Elwha will be completed by the end of the year. Establishment of these new MRC units brings the total of Tribal MRCs in Washington State to 7.

Orientation and training is being developed and will roll out by January 2010.

Initial grant acquisition was completed for Shoalwater Bay and Yakama Tribes along with annual follow on grants for NWTEMC, Samish, and Tulalip. Unfortunately, Lower Elwha did not meet the deadline; however we will be re-submitting this grant next year.

### MRC activities performed include:

- Tulalip working in collaboration with Snohomish MRC for coordinated trainings and response.
- Samish had their first Emergency Preparedness Workshop on September 11th, which was well attended and generated a large response to a request for registration of volunteers.
- All units participated in various tabletops and communications exercises throughout the year.
- Region 1 MRC units (Tribal and Non-Tribal) developed a coalition to request additional funding from Region 1 EMS.
- Snoqualmie: Was granted an AmeriCorps Vista worker that conducted several inhouse trainings and coordinated with several local units.

#### Website

We offer these documents free of charge to be used and modified by our Tribal Governments. The site also offers a grants page that lists all current grant offerings, and also provides for grant templates that can be used by our Tribal Partners. Our calendar sends out automatic notifications to our members every weekend, so that a new and fresh calendar of events will appear in their email each and every Monday morning. NWTEMC hires contractors to perform services such as MRC Coordinator, CERT training and Communications planning.

On July  $18^{th}$ , 2009, NWTEMC received its letter from the IRS granting Non-profit status as a 501(c)(3) Non-Profit Organization.

The NWTEMC is currently receiving or has received the following grants:

FY 2008 Tribal Supplement Homeland Security Grant: \$156,500

Purpose: Allow for the creation and sustainability of the NWTEMC. Provide training to Tribes

FY2008 Interoperability Emergency Communications Grant: \$143,200

Purpose: Increase Interoperability Communications capabilities amongst Tribes and between Tribes/State/local gov't.

2009 Dept. of Health CERT Training Grant: \$100,000

Purpose: Provide 9 CERT Trainings to the Tribes statewide. Purchase and deliver 1 CERT trailer to host Tribe in each Homeland Security Region

2009 NACCHO/Medical Reserve Corps award Samish Nation: \$10,000

Purpose: Samish Nation has signed over MRC award so that NWTEMC could administrate on it's behalf. Purpose is to create an MRC unit for Samish Nation/Anacortes area and to work with NWTEMC Statewide Unit.

2009 NACCHO/Medical Reserve Corps award, NWTEMC: \$5000

Purpose: Continue to build Statewide Tribal MRC unit. Used to pay part-time, contracted Coordinator.
