GENERAL SITUATION and AFFECTED JURISDICTIONS:

The Center for Disease Control (CDC) and the World Health Organization (WHO) report swine influenza (swine flu) has been identified in the United States, Canada, Mexico, and Europe. DOH is working closely with state local health agencies to monitor cases of pneumonia and influenza. Health care providers and laboratories in Washington are watching for influenza, especially in people who traveled to Mexico or other affected areas.

Lab testing found the swine flu virus is susceptible to prescription antiviral drugs - oseltamivir and zanamivir.

5/2/09 - WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION (WHO) PANDEMIC FLU ALERT LEVEL: Phase 5

FEDERAL: Public Health Emergency declared on April 26, 2009.

CDC: Emergency Operations Center activated. CDC will provide updated guidance and new

information as it becomes available. One death confirmed in Texas.

WHO: 1124 confirmed cases, 26 deaths

HHS: The Secretary's Operation Center (SOC) continues to monitor and provide updates as needed.

Strategic National Stockpile (SNS) - CDC has released 25% of Washington's allocation of the CDC antiviral stockpile and supplies.

5/4/09 As of today all SNS deliveries to the RSS facility have been completed. The RSS staff is in the process of building individual LHJ deliveries.

5/3/09 CDC recommendations for school closures is now available at the following website:

5/3/09 – Public Health is no longer recommending school closures for probable cases. Symptomatic students should not report to school.

5/1/09. Public health lab has increased testing capacity for people who have influenza "A" where the subtype is not known and for travelers from affected areas with influenza-like illness.

4/28/09: LHJ administrators advised the state is receiving antivirals from the SNS. Notified local public health and health care providers of the possibility of swine flu in Washington. DOH provided the guidelines to recognize and report possible cases to DOH and the process to send samples to the the public health lab for more tests.

WA:

Visits to the ER or Urgent Care Centers in WA state have greatly increased (4/28-5/1) over the previous 2 week baseline (for 5/1: 98% increase in fever/flu cases, 8% of all encounters). There has also been a 1% increase in all encounters on 05/01. The 2 week average of fever/flu case reports (4/16-4/29) from all syndromic surveillance sites is 51 cases which comprised 4.1% of all ER and Urgent Care encounters.

HOSPITAL STATUS:

No Report at this time.

LOCAL HEALTH JURISDICTION (LHJ) STATUS:

5/4/09 Seattle King Co. has received their requested SNS supplies.

5/4/09 SNS supplies on truck and on the road to Spokane. Delivery is expected sometime after 8:00a.m. today.

5/4/09 3:00p.m. Three trucks currently in staging status.

5/1/09: Most regions have reported that pharmacies do not have commercially available antivirals in stock. All public health regions have implemented command and control with increased surveillance.

Resource Requests: LHJ requests for specimen transport kits must submit requests through the DOH EOC. Components for 120 test kits have been ordered and will be assembled at the PHL and readied for distribution. Additional components for 880 kits have been ordered and should arrive by 5/5/09.

Region 1 (Snohomish County Health District):

4/28/09: Opened a call center to address public inquiries and provide updated public health information related

to the H1N1 incident.

Region 3 (Grays Harbor County):

4/28/09: Public health has requested 15 viral collection kits.

Region 4 (Clark County):

4/28/09: Requested 200 influenza rapid test kits kits as they have exhausted all local resources.

Region 6 (King County):

4/28/09: King County EOC has been activated.

CURRENT HEALTH and MEDICAL RESPONSE ACTIVITIES (Local)

DOH:

5/04/2009- Spanish language information line will be added to the English language version and should be activated on 5/5/09.

5/04/2009- The DOH Health Officer will be recording a public service announcement (PSA) in Spanish on 5/05/09.

5/04/2009- There have been 61,000 hits on the DOH Swine Flu website since the beginning of the event.

5/04/09- The DOH is working closely with officials in Oregon and Idaho to obtain information on Washington residents suspected of having the H1N1 and are being treated or tested in Oregon or Idaho.

5/04/09- Epi will be updating their webpage to provide updated guidance on the criteria that will be used for specimen testing.

5/03/09- PHL reports they now have reagents for sub-type testing. The lab is developing a plan so testing can begin on Monday. The first 5 tests need to be confirmed at the CDC before confirmatory reports can be issued by PHL.

5/2/09 – CDC has informed us that we have received all of our allocation from the SNS. The supplies have been inventoried and stored. Working on distribution of SNS supplies to LHJ's. Final distribution schedule is not yet available.

5/1/09: Margaret Hansen, PHEPR At-Risk/Vulnerable Populations Manager is the new DOH lead for schools/OSPI. (margaret.hansen@doh.wa.gov or 360.236-4026)

5/1/09: DOH is checking with HHS to determine if the PREP Act (Act) was evoked when HHS declared the federal emergency. A PREP Act declaration provides tort liability immunity and is not dependent on other emergency declarations. The Act also authorizes a U. S. Treasury emergency fund to compensate for injuries directly caused by administration or use of a countermeasure covered by the declaration.

5/1/09: DOH is modifying risk factor guidelines and guidance for medical examiners.

4/29/09: Monitoring the evolving event. DOH established contact with Oregon, Idaho, Alaska and B.C..

DOH is currently considering an agreement with major larger pharmacies to assist with dispensing

medications. The discussions continue.

DOH is coordinating with EMD if a Governor's declaration is warranted.

DOH has advised the LHJs they should document all costs for reimbursement purposes, but there is no guarantee that costs will be reimbursed.

LHJs are encouraged to ensure that Public Health Mutual Aid Agreements are in place and used as appropriate.

4/28/09, 4:00 PM: DOH released a high level WASECURES Alert. This alert requested that the LHJs advise the percent of their allocation of antivirals and supplies from the Strategic National Stockpile they want to receive.

Federal:

Health and Human Services Secretary Kathleen Sebelius announced that the Federal government will purchase an additional 13 million treatment courses to help fight influenza, including the 2009 H1N1 flu virus. The additional treatment courses will be added to the Strategic National Stockpile. HHS began moving 400,000 treatment courses to Mexico.

Food and Drug Administration's Office of General Counsel confirmed that the CDC's Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) for antiviral drugs will cover state and locally purchased stockpiles. Further EUA guidance will be posted on the CDC webpage http://www.cdc.gov/swineflu/guidance/. FDA has requested that reports of adverse reactions to antiviral agents be posted to: www.fda.gov/medwatch or 1-800-FDA -1088.

DOH PHEPR staff is holding daily conference calls with Emergency Management Dept. 10:00 a.m. daily through Monday, May 4th.
